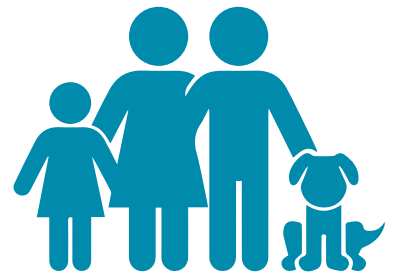

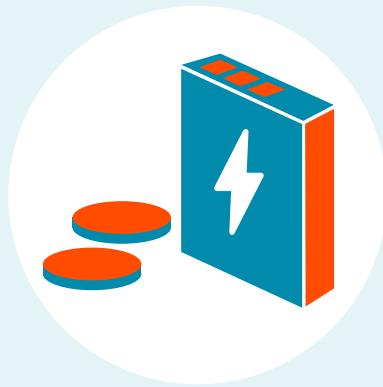
WHY SHOULD YOU RECYCLE RECHARGEABLE BATTERIES?

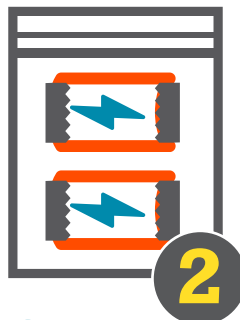
